Subject: Proposed Trail across DRA Meadow

Concerning the flagging for possible trail going across the meadow near Lotzgesell at Dungeness Recreation Area (flagging is approximately from 5 Acre School Area to DRA entrance area.

This trail goes across some very valuable wildlife habitat. It is habitat for many bird species of which some need undisturbed habitat. It is the best habitat in DRA for the Northern Harrier and is one of the few areas that still gets Short-eared Owls which are rapidly declining. A developed trail will bring more people into this area and cause additional disturbance. People from all over come to take pictures of these birds from the current existing trail.

The numbers of people using DRA has also increased greatly. DRA already has a large amount of trails and there are plenty of routes and loops already. One reason people come to DRA is to go for a walk and see the scenery and wildlife. Many of the public were quite vocal on that during the park master planning a few years ago. The wildlife prefer the larger undeveloped areas of the park and seek refuge in them. People can view this meadow area from the trail that goes on its north edge from the large parking area to the trailhead spot by the 5 Acre School. Many species want to use the lowland habitat north of Hwy 101. The challenge is that habitat is becoming smaller with development and wildlife are being pushed into smaller and smaller areas. We already know that someday, in DRA a new access road portion will probably need to be constructed because of the bluff erosion, thus existing habitat will be lost there so the remaining undeveloped portions of DRA are very important for the wildlife.

Unless I'm missing something, I don't see this proposed trail in the Park Master Plan. Please do not build this trail. My purpose of writing this is not so much for my needs, as reality is the odds are that this is my last decade at my age. Im writing this for the future generations for them to enjoy nature in the Sequim area and for the wildlife whose habitat is disappearing north of Hwy 101 between Sequim and Port Angeles. Where would we be if people in the county had not once had the wisdom to save areas like DRA and Salt Creek.

Subject: Clallam County Parks Department Grants Status

Federal:

FEMA/WA MIL – 97.036 – FEMA November 2022 Storms (Robin Hill)

Jesse Goodman, Roads Engineer, is the point on this opportunity. The reimbursement is in process, and I am awaiting an update on the situation.

State:

WA RCO – Camp David Jr Aquatics Program

The grant provides replacement canoes for existing 1980 vintage units and provides funding for canoe training and aquatic safety. This project is underway. Canoes are ordered, and logos for canoes are ordered. We will commence working on the Aquatic Safety program next month. *\$24,000 no match*

WA RCO – Lake Pleasant Dock Renovation

Grant provides replacement dock pilings for units destroyed in the November 2021 storm. This project is underway but paused due to WSFW's "Fish Window." The contract was awarded, and work is scheduled to commence on July 17, 2024, and be complete in 1-2 weeks. *\$140,000 25% match*

DOE – WCC – Environmental Justice Pilot Grant

Grant provides supplemental trained labor for current Robin Hill Farm County Park storm restoration and planned trail development. This project is underway. Limited recordkeeping is required, and there is no funding exchange. *\$60,000+ value, no match*

RCO – Deferred Maintenance Grant

This grant award is a collaboration between Roads and Parks. Steve Grey, Deputy Director of Roads, is the point of this opportunity. The grant provides funding to replace the existing restroom roof and insulate pipe chase to allow for 12-month utilization. The Roads Department portion of the grant will purchase equipment to better service the Olympic Discovery Trail. The Grant has been awarded but has not yet been accepted by the county. It is scheduled to be completed in 2024. *\$92,000 no match*

LTAC 2nd Call Grant

The grant award provides funding to design, fabricate, and install a 65' Ramp at Clallam Bay County Park Beach Access Bridge *\$75,000 no-match*

Subject: Considerations on County Sani-Kan Specification

After consulting with the primary Sani-Kan rental vendor on the North Olympic Peninsula, which includes Olympic National Park (ONP), Washington State Parks, the Department of Natural Resources, and Clallam County, we have considered the following factors.

In more remote locations, Sani-Kans are highly susceptible to vandalism. The vendor states that wheelchair-accessible units, due to their more spacious design, are more susceptible to vandalism than the standard alternative, and the replacement cost for a unit is approximately \$3,000. One thousand dollars more than a conventional unit.

Wheelchair-accessible units lack a urinal, requiring more frequent cleaning, making them challenging for unisex use. Additionally, they cost \$275 monthly, whereas the monthly rental cost of a standard unit is \$100.00.

After evaluating these factors, we have come to understand that the ONP has decided not to pursue long-term rental of wheelchair-accessible Sani-Kans in more remote areas of the park. This decision sets a precedent for Clallam County Parks, which will continue specifying eight standard Sani-Kans.

The need for heightened accessibility in county parks is not just a requirement but a genuine and pressing need that should be prioritized. In the case of restrooms, all future permanent vaults and conventional comfort stations should be designed and built in compliance with ADA standards.
