Last week I presented you with an update of scientific evidence concerning vaccines & the spread of Covid.

The main points here are:

- 1) The mandate in Clallam County to segregate unvaccinated persons as well as require all citizens to display a 'vaccine passport' to enter eating establishments has NO BASIS IN REAL SCIENCE.
- 2) Unvaccinated persons are not the enemy! The unvaccinated are being targeted as a political scapegoat to keep people from seeing what is really going on. **The vaccine itself is causing illness, creating variants & spreading the virus! No gov't body should coerce anyone to take this toxic injection!**
- 3) This mandate unjustly discriminates against we the people, impairing our ability to enjoy our lawful lives & penalizing our businesses with over-reaching restrictions.

What are our options:

- 1) Place a moratorium on the mandate which requires passports to enter eating establishments, and violates the rights of unvaccinated people in our community.
- 2) Look at options that are working around the country and the world. ie

A, Monoclonal antibody therapy in outreach locations to take the pressure off our hospital system. Look into it.

B. The use of time tested medications ie ivermectin & Hydroxychloroquine. In India the gov't issued ivermectin to the adult population & dropped the outbreak of Covid & the death rate by 80%. Research it! Even the WHO lists Ivermectin as one of the safest medications in use for the past 30-40 years.

C. Investigate why there's such a hard push to vaccinate the population with an untested experimental injection that has never been approved for human use when there are other options available.

D. Look up Dr Peter McCullough's, (most published cardiologist) work effectively applying early treatment for Covid patients & condemning the strategy to delay treatment.

CONCLUSION:

I appeal to you once again Gentlemen, to deter from this UNCONSTITUTIONAL, IMMORAL, & UNSCIENTIFIC mandate now in place in Clallam County.

We the people will not be stopped until this mandate is stricken down. If no action is taken, and we the people are forced to take lawful action, every single public servant who remains complicit in the unconstitutional rollout of this mandate will be name individually in any such action that may be required.

Is this what we want? NO. Our first priority is to work with you and public health officials to protect the safety of all citizens while protecting our inalienable rights guaranteed by the constitutions of both Washington State and the United States of America.
