APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes for the meeting on 01/06/2026 were unanimously approved.

BUSINESS ITEMS

- Carolyn of PAIR was present as public, and was given a member application if she cares to join the committee. She reported that PAIR will hold a spay/neuter clinic on 2/15 for small dogs only. Their mobile clinic bus should be operational in May. PAIR did 583 surgeries in 2025, and had 265 adoptions or transfers out.
- Friends of Forks (through Ed) reported that for January total they'd had 8 cats and 3 dog intakes, and 11 animals out.
- Lily's rehomed 2 roosters in Jan, and created the goal for the year to establish volunteer teams and source supplies for fence or pen building or mending.
- UPCOMING FAIRGROUNDS CLINIC
 - Planning for 4-6 surgery tables.
 - Ed talked with Clallam Transit about increased animals on routes – non-service animals need to be in crates
 - What will the proof of income requirements be?
 - Could we split future clinics so that we use multiple locations? Something along the lines of all large dogs are at x, and small dogs are at y.
 - Can we have food to hand out at the clinic? Meagan will check on her source, but it is hard to predict when food is available. Barb will ask CoOp for expired food.
 - Can we use Capstar for flea treatments?
- We should revisit the concept of ways to restrict puppy selling/breeding – Mark Ozias is not present but plans to bring information he's researched on this to the March meeting.
- PAIR uses "Last Litter" agreements to entice owners to fix their animals.
